Best wishes for a joyous holiday season and a prosperous New Year ahead.

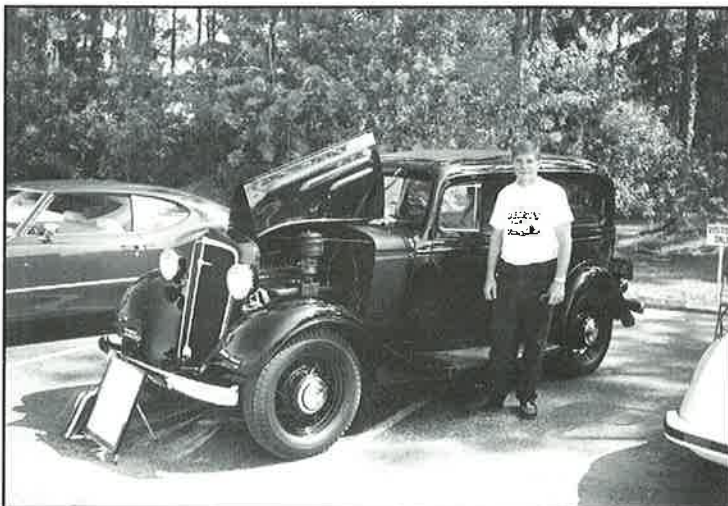

Other available diagnostic tests included blood tests for prostate cancer, complete Coronary Risk Profiles and Skin Cancer Screening. On site Mammograms were available thanks to the Mobile Mammography Unit.
